- 1. Applicant/ Rice Importer/Distributor must have a valid business registration for FY 2019 for the importation and sale of rice in Liberia.
- 2. Applicant/Rice Importer/Distributor must have current Tax Clearance for FY 2018/2019.
- 3. Applicant /Rice Importer/Distributor must have a warehouse with the capacity of not less than 10,000mt and must be within the vicinity of the Freeport of Monrovia and should be a bounded warehouse.
- 4. Applicant/Rice Importer/Distributor must have at least three (3) years' experience of selling and distributing the Japanese KR Food Aid in the Republic of Liberia.
- 5. Applicant/ Rice Importer/Distributor must have a verifiable list of at least five (5) retailers/distributors in nine (9) of the political sub-divisions of Liberia.
- 6. Applicant/ Rice Importer/Distributor Must have registered with the Public Procurement and Concession Commission (PPCC) registry.
- 7. Applicant must submit an Insurance Bond to cover just 2% of the products cost that will be consigned to the applicant for a period not more than four (4) months.
- 8. Applicant must demonstrate its ability of making direct deposit of the rice proceed into an account to be established at the CBL and

submit a photo copy of its bank deposit slips to the Japanese Counterpart Value Fund Secretariat on a weekly basis.

- 9. Finally, applicant must have the ability of moving the rice to the retailed outlets within Monrovia and its environs at no cost to the retailers/buyers of the KR Rice.
- 10. The ceiling price that a bidder or distributor can offer must not exceed **US\$12.15** per 30KG bag or its equivalent in Liberian Dollars.
